Flash: The federal government may soon be in the business of tearing down billboards, according to a story in *The State* newspaper in Columbia, S.C.

The Federal Highway Administration has ordered states to tear down signs that don't conform to local or state regulations. About 100,000 billboards across the country are going to be coming down by 1994. The federal government will help pay to compensate the owners.

About one third of all billboards, or 3,200, in North Carolina could be removed.

According to an editorial in the *Charlotte Observer* this law may tap taxpayers' wallets, but it "promises some relief from an artificial horizon that comes in chunks 30 feet high by 40 feet long."
