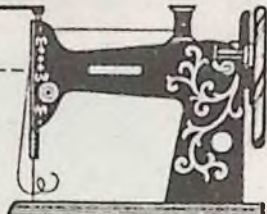


### A Familiar Sight

### Columbus Starts Work On Sign Ordinance

Columbus Town Councilman Dr. Thomas V. Belling Thursday night announced his efforts to make the council towards adoption of a sign ordinance. Since taking his seat on the board in November, Belling has at each meeting raised the question. His efforts Thursday were rewarded with an assignment. "You come up with an ordinance that is acceptable to business and law-abiding people."

On a motion made by Councilman Robert E. Grinstead, Belling and Town Administrator Butch Smith were assigned to a committee to draft a sign ordinance for Columbus. Belling said rather than lead Smith working alone he intends to consult business people including the members of the merchant's association. "Somewhere, somehow, we have to start saying what we want in the appearance of the town," Belling said. He said he has reviewed ordinances from Sanford, Tryon, Siler City and the
