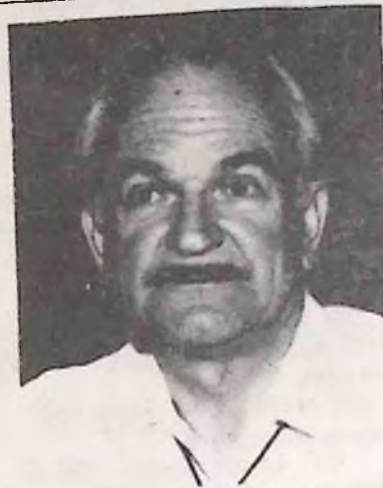
Buys Acreage
