Revolutionary War Encampment To Be At FENCE

The Revolutionary War is perhaps the most important time period of our nation's history, and S.C. played a major role during this war. What better way to understand and appreciate the life of a Revolutionary War soldier than to actually be a soldier for a weckend!

Fifth grade students at O.P. Earle have the opportunity to recreate the Revolutionary War era by participating in a Revolutionary War Encampment. O.P. Earle is the only school in S.C., and as far as we know the U.S., which participates in an overnight encampment.

On the weekend of April 25 and 26, members of the Second Regiment, S.C. Line, Continental Establishment, will conduct an authentic Revolutionary War Encampment at Foothills Equestrian Nature Center. Students will actually live like soldiers. They will learn about customs of the 18th century, blacksmithing, firestarting, and firing flintlock muskets (with blank cartridges). Students will help prepare food, carry water and wood and will perform numerous other duties as instructed by Regiment officers. One of these duties is to set up camp according to British Rules of Order of 1756.

Students will have the opportunities to learn firsthand about making butter and corn husk people, Native American artifacts, military tactics, spinning, old tools and wood shaping, wood chopping, games, survival in nature and music.

There may also be a surprise attack by British and Hessian soldiers who try to persuade students, soldiers to defect to the side of the British, as well as a visit from Native Americans.

Learning stations also will include a discussion of 18th century clothing styles as well as why George Washington's tent, the Marquee, had a chandelier, silver utensil, carpet, a real bed, table, and chairs.

We feel this opportunity to be of extraordinary nature, we invite you to step back in time with us and experience life during Revolutionary War days.
