## Phillips Campaigns For N.C. Supt.'s Job In Columbus Fri.

Owen Phillips brought his campaign for the office of State Superintendent of Public Instruction to Democratic Headquarters in Columbus early Friday morning.

Phillips, currently on leave from his post as superintendent of High Point Public Schools, said he wants to bring a professional's experience to the office.

"What we have now is a former hardware store owner," Phillips said of State Supt. Bobby Etheridge. "While there is nothing wrong with that occupation, what we need is a professional at the helm of our profession."

Phillips was being hosted on his Western N.C. campaign tour by Polk County Supt. James Causby, who endorsed him in introductory remarks Friday.

Phillips said he and Causby both supported Etheridge during the last campaign, believing his legislative powers would be good for the schools.

But both men have become disenchanted with the former legislator's handling of educational matters, he said. Phillips said Etheridge is pursuing the "Three R's – Rules, Regulations and Restrictions."

The bureaucracy at the state level is too self-serving and too little concerned with children's education, Phillips said. He cited as an example the fact that
