## Godlock Breaks Regional Records

Karen Godlock of Polk County broke three records and finished first in four races during the Western Regional 1-A/2-A track meet held Saturday at Hendersonville High School.

Godlock broke regional records in the 3200-meter run (11:34.9), the 1600-meter run (5:12.5) and the 800-meter run (2:21.3) and she was a member of the winning 3200-meter relay team which set a new record (10:15.3).

Pat McEntyre of Polk County won first place in the 400-meter dash (1:01.9).

The top four finishers in each race advance to the state track meet this Saturday in Chapel Hill.

In addition to Godlock and McEntyre, the following track athletes from Polk County qualified for the state track meet were: Otis Miller in the long jump and 400-meter dash; Duron Davis in the triple jump; Brendon Palmer in the pole vault; Seth Peoples in the 1600-meter and 3200-meter runs; and Jenny McGrane in the 1600-meter and 800-meter runs.
