The estimated cotton crop of 1894-5, already in eight as per February report of the United States Agricultural Department is 9,581,120, with 10.1 per cent yet in the hands of producers. This gives a total of 10,549,002 bales. The final report will appear in April, when the report will be revised and reduced to the utmost accuracy attainable. The total crop of Texas is put at 2,861,653 in sight, which, with 10.1 per cent added makes something over 3,150,000 bales, or nearly one-third of the entire cotton crop of the country. These are alluring figures, and are "grand gloomy and peculiar," when taken in connection with the price at which this great staple is marketed. One more such crop and the financial judgment.

THE REAL DANGER.

The great danger that threatens this country is not political demagoguery; not a corrupt ballot; not bribery; not federal encroachment. Bateful as these are, the people could get rid of them if the stream of public virtue were not poisoned at its source. The innumerable lodges, clubs, saloons and other nocturnal resorts, constitute a tenfold greater danger. It is in such places as these that all our social, moral and political ills are incubated. Anything that tends to discourage the marriage relation, or to weaken its ties after they have been assumed; anything that tends to foster immorality and vice, as these agents notoriously do, corrupts our national life, where it begins, and makes all other evils welcome. Men and women are driven to avoid the bonds of matrimony, that they may enjoy a larger liberty, and a broader license, and every year adds largely to the number of those who ought not to marry. Soldiers, sailors, explorers, and adventurers ought not to marry; highwaymen, train robbers and men who frequent the clubs and saloons ought not to marry, for that would propagate their vices and increase the danger. To remedy these evils is the problem of the age. Who is equal to its solution?

Mr. John Graham, of Ridgeway, was "no where" in the race for Railroad Commissioner, having got only two votes—Ohio Wilson got the plum. It does seem a shame that such a man should have beaten Mr. Graham. Mr. Graham says Treasurer Worth said Wilson was a good party man, was poor and in debt, his home was mortgaged, and he must have something. It is nice, right, proper and generous to help these in distress, but this should be done by friends in a private way; and it is not right to give a man a public office who is unfit for it simply because he is a good party man and in debt.
