The only sail to be seen was the flying jib hanging over the boom, split to pieces, and not worth taking. She was about 200 to 250 tons burthen, painted black She with a wide white streak and ports; had a gilt billet head, bowsprit painted black as far out as the head, the rest of it white, with varnished jib and flying jibbooms. Her decks were entirely consumed. Herstern was burnt down to the transum, which was about two feet above water. The hold was nearly full of cargo of some kind, which was on fire .-She doubtless sunk a short time after we passed her, as the water occasionally washed in and raised a steam as we were passing. Capt. Bailey thinks there is no doubt but the crew are safe, as it was fine weather, and had been nearly calm for three or four days previous, so that they would have been safe in the smallest boat. There were 13 sails in sight from the masthead at sunrise, steering different ways .-She looked like an American, and not more than 5 or 6 years old.
