29.217 This gives total of 199 ships, 2,718 guns, and 29,217 officers and men. There are, however, about 1,000 supernumeraries not included; and this number is exclusive of marines ashore at their respecfive divisions.- U. S. Gazette.

The Whiskey Trade.

But few persons have a correct view of the amount of Whiskey annually consumed in this city in manufacture of Domestic Liquors, Alcohol, Burning Fluid &c. &c. There are four Distilleries in the immediate vicinity of this city, which consume about 300,000 bushels of Corn and Rye yearly, and produce 1,050, 000 gallons of Whiskey, valued at \$275,000. The se works are all driven by steam, and consume 3,000 tons of Coul annually. They employ from seventy to eighty workmen, and the amount of capital invested cannot be less than half a million of dolfare. Besides this amount there was received last year by the Columbia Mailroad 562,825 gallons and by the Deleware Canal 1,432,815 gallons, which added to the amount manufactured by the city distilleries makes 3,045,640 gailons, equal to about 101,521 barrels. To this we must add a considerable amount received amually by the Schuylkill and Tidewater Canal, and New York; which would swell the total amount to 125 a 130,000 barrels. Phil. Com, List.


