

depression in the market for money stocks. The money market exhibits no change. Exchange on London quiet—no change to notice.

The transactions in flour have been only to a moderate extent. The demand is mostly for the west and home use; no shipping inquiry. The sales reach only 3,000 bbls., at \$4.67 a bbl for common Western and State brands; prime Genesee \$5.50; Southern is dull—small sales of Baltimore at \$5., and Georgetown and Petersburg 5.12 & 5.13.; Canadian 4.81 a bbl. Rye flour \$3, and corn meal \$2.87 per bbl.

Corn is steady and active. The sales amount to 60,000 bushels, at 57 a 58 cents for mixed and yellow, Oats 35 a 40 cents. Sales of rye at 60 cents.

Nothing new to notice in provisions.

There has been an improvement in rice, with an active business. The sales to-day amount to 700 bbls. at 31 to 35-16 cents per lb. for Carolina.

The cotton market is steady at 4d a cent per lb., decline since the arrival of the steamer. Sales to-day of 1,500 bales of middling upland for export at 121 cents, for uplands 131 and Orleans 131 a 133 per lb. The market closed rather in favor of holders.

Naval stores continue in good demand. Crude Turpentine \$2.75 per barrel, and sales of spirits at \$3 a 34 cents per gallon.

PHILADELPHIA MARKET.  
Feb. 27. We have a delightful day—the weather warm and spring like.

The stock market is firm, and government securities have advanced. Pennsylvania 55 90. Nothing new to notice in the money market.

Flour is quiet—sales of 400 barrels at 5.75 a \$5.1 for common and choice brands. Rye flour unchanged—not much in request. Small sales of Corn Meal at 2.65 a \$2.93.

The supply of grain is not large. Sales of red Wheat to the amount of 2000 bushels, at 1.01 a \$1.05 white do. 1.12 a \$1.13. Corn is steady—sales of 5,000 bushels at 54 a 55 cents for yellow; white and mixed 52 a 53 cents. Oats 42 a 43 cents. Rye 61 a 64 cents per bushel.

Provisions steady—sales of Mess Pork at 11 a \$11.12; prime unchanged. Lard in barrels 61 cents, kgs 7 cents.

Groceries are steady. Coffee held firmly, but no sales. Rice 3 a 3.16 cents per lb. Sugars range from 41 to 61 for Orleans, or so quality. Marmalade 57 cents per gallon for Oldans.

The Tobacco market is firm. Wool is in steady request, with sales of woolshed at 36 to 40 cents per lb., as to quality.

Cotton still remains quiet—sales of 200 bales at 1 a 2 cents declining since the news.

Whisky is quiet—sales at 24 a 25 cents per gallon.

Naval Stores. Small sales Spirits Turpentine are making at 35 cents, no other reports.

There is no change to notice in other articles usually spoken of in the market.

FOREIGN MARKET.  
Liverpool, Feb. 8. The sales of Turpentine since the 25th ult. reach 2,000 bbls. at 78 6d per cwt, with little remaining in first hands. A few retail sales of Rosin have been made at 3s 4d a 3s 5d per cwt.

Rice.—100 tierces Carolina have been sold at 19s 6d a ton. East India descriptions are dull of sale. We quote Bengal white 9 a 11s 6d, Cargos 7 a 8s 6d; Madras 7 a 9s 6d; Java 7 a 12s 6d.
