

# Human Survival Talks Planned

Consumer advocate Ralph Nader will deliver the keynote address in a symposium on human survival at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

He will speak Monday, March 23, at 8 p.m. in Memorial Hall.

The symposium, "One World. Your Future...?" (March 23-April 6) will focus on the limits of the world's growth potential. "We are trying to educate people on how they can coexist with an environment in an ecological system," said symposium chairman Larry Shirley.

William Ruckelshaus, former director of the Environmental Protection Agency; Stuart Udall, former Secretary of the Interior Department; author Garrett Hardin; and nutritionist Jean Mayer are among the other speakers participating in the symposium. The Carolina Union Current Affairs Committee, Institute of Nutrition, Institute of Environmental Studies and the Carolina Population Center are sponsoring the symposium.

"Human survival is in jeopardy," said Shirley, a junior from Cary. "The starvation of millions, the struggle for scarce resources and growing numbers of environmental disruptions are signs that there is little time to avert disaster on an unprecedented scale. People must learn to cut down consumption and change their lifestyles," he said.

During the week of March 23-27, experts will define the problems threatening human survival and provide a forum

for discussion. Programs at 11 a.m., 2, 4, and 8 p.m. will allow for a diverse set of opinions to be aired, Shirley said.
