

Pond Giants Edge By W-S Indians

Billy Dickey, the hottest pitcher in the Winston-Salem Semi-Pro League tossed a four-hitter Sunday for his fifth victory as the Pond Giants topped the Indians 3-2 at Ernie Shore Field.

The ace righthander got all the support he needed in the first inning as the Giants got all three of their runs on RBI singles by Ken Valentine and John Spease.

The same two teams will

meet again this Sunday night at 8 back at Ernie Shore Field. Dickey is again scheduled to pitch for the Giants. He will be looking for his sixth win without a loss. Mike Smith will probably be the Indians starter.

A home-run contest will precede the game featuring Ed Greene, John Spease, Ken Valentine and Mars Shaw of the Giants and, Curtis

Roseboro, James "Pookie" Bailey, Charles Rice and Ted Petree of the Indians.

In WSBL action last week the Greensboro All-Stars remained undefeated but were tied by Stokesdale 7-7. The All-Stars whipped Mount Airy 8-1 in their other league game.

The Pond Giants strengthened their hold on second place by beating the Braves 8-7, while the third place knights split two games nipping the Indians 2-1 and losing to Stokesdale 2-1.

In other games, the fourth place Indians shut out winless Oak Ridge 6-0. The Braves topped the Pirates 6-1 and squeaked by Oak Ridge 6-5, while Mount Airy beat the Pirates 6-2.

State gets

HEW Grant

The State has received a \$1,680,514 federal grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for fiscal year 1976-77 to assist all levels of planning in the state. Governor Jim Holshouser announced recently.

Under HUD's Comprehensive Planning Program, the funds will be shared by regional planning agencies, large cities, counties, and small communities throughout the state.

Three large cities which have chosen to receive grant assistance through the state are: Raleigh, \$45,000; High Point, \$35,000; and Fayetteville, \$22,000.

Fourteen of the 17 regional planning agencies in the state will be given a total of \$581,521 of the grant.

The N.C. Department of Natural and Economic Resources will receive \$540,000 which it will allocate to small cities and counties. The remaining \$457,093 will fund statewide planning activities based in the Department of Administration.

"Although funds under this program have been cut by one-quarter nationally, North Carolina received only 16 percent less than it received for the previous fiscal year. Our state's activities in land policy development, the Coastal Management Act and the overall quality of planning throughout the state account for HUD's awarding North Carolina a grant at a rate above the national average," said Governor Holshouser.

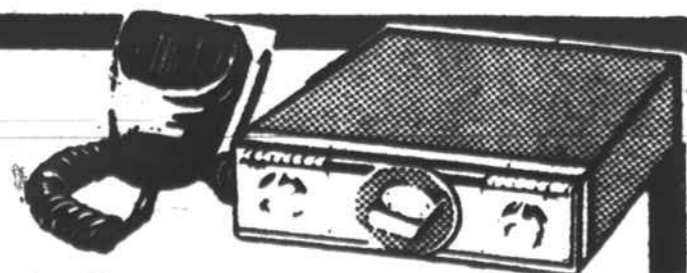
