property damage accidents increased 7.7% over last year. Pedestrians killed showed an increase of 4.4%.

Accidents on county roads showed the largest jump for the six month period with an increase of 22%. Powell said the new enforcement emphasis by the State Highway Patrol on these roads since July of this year should have a positive impact.

"The improved energy situation vastly increased car sales and the extensive Bicentennial travels have created extremely crowded

conditions on our highway across North Carolina. The

conditions coupled with less inattention to good driving habits by a few cars is a great concern for all motorists. We must be increasingly alert to personal responsibility, drive defensively and operate our vehicles in a manner not only to ensure our own safety, but the safety of others. The rule of the road

must be the Golden Rule. Commissioner Powell concluded.
