ago as exhibits preparator under a CETA grant, and now he will share some of his expertise and techniques with area residents during a four-week course to start February 12 at the Nature Science Park.

"Silkscreening Nature" will begin at 10 a.m. Saturday, February 12, with an orientation and introduction to silk-screening techniques. Intended as an introduction to silk-screening and nature design, the workshop is open to all family members and individuals aged nine and up.

Grant's position as exhibits preparator is one of many made available by CETA (Comprehensive Employment Training Act) grants over the last two years. The Nature Science Park has been the beneficiary of a number of these jobs, and has thus been enabled to make remarkable progress in renovating the buildings of the former Forsyth County Nursing Home and constructing exhibits.

Many CETA positions have been phased out over the last 6-8 months, but Grant's job and three others are still being funded, enabling the Park to continue development, although on a somewhat reduced schedule.
