

Mike Brown Will Be Missed

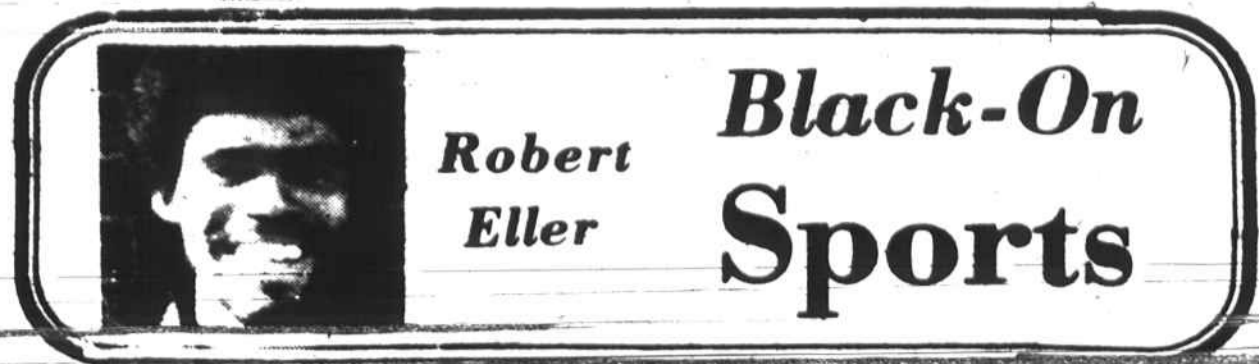
Michael Brown a 6-5 senior forward has "been dropped from the Winston-Salem State Ram basketball squad.

Brown from Dobbs Ferry, New York emerged from the teams dressing room at halftime of the teams game with Livingstone last Thursday night in street clothes.

A member of the All-CIAA tournament team last season, Brown was expected to be a big part of the Rams drive for the league title this season. Through the first six games he was the teams second leading scorer and rebounder. Brown then began to have problems with his knees, a problem later diagnosed as arthritis and was forced to miss two games. He never returned to his old form and began to see less and less playing time as freshman Mike Robinson began to show improvement. He did not start another game until that night in Salisbury.

Brown, when asked to comment after leaving the locker room simply said, "I'm finished for the season."

Later he said that he had been in conflict with Rams coach Clarence Gaines, "Coach said I was loafing when I made a few mistakes but I wasn't loafing. This has

been a problem year for me. I started out playing well but after the knee problems I never got back into shape," he said.

Gaines said Brown withdrew for health reasons, "he has a severe case of arthritis. He came back late after Christmas and he hasn't been able to go all out since." The coach did hint that Brown had been giving less than 100% and wondered openly if that had affected the team.

The Rams got good news and bad news late this week. The good news Carlos Terry is fully recovered from his bout with tonsillitis and should be 100% for the Ram finale Friday night against Virginia State and the CIAA tournament.

The bad news -- Don Helton the teams All-CIAA guard and second leading scorer will not play Friday night because of a painful heel injury. Doctors expect Helton to be out for a week to ten days. However,

the gutsy senior guard guaranteed his return for the conference tournament "even on crutches."

Despite the recent developments both team and coach are looking forward to the tournament.

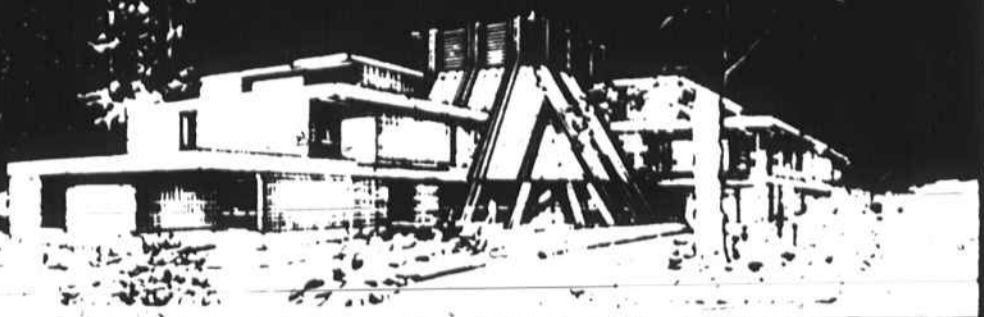
Gaines says the teams chances in the tourney "are as good as any." Gaines says that there is great balance among the eight qualifying teams and that "on a given night any one of the teams can knock off any other, all eight squads are very capable."

Terry who will have his tonsils removed during spring break is looking forward to the tournament. "The loss of the southern division title will make us play harder in the tournament, we're already practicing harder."

Helton hobbling around on crutches, after being told to go home by trainer Buddy Taylor says, "I'm looking forward to the tournament its the only
