Christopher McCall, general manager, states, "One goal of the paper is to expose the achievements and success of blacks in our community that it may inspire other black people to become

involved in community activities and projects." He continues, "The paper will attempt to inform the black community of issues that concern us." He cited examples in housing, employment, education and the general welfare of black citizens.

Mason McCullough, circulation manager, and Don Bailey, advertising

manager, express their views: "We see the paper as a benefit to the people in the area. It's really the people's paper and it will take the people's support to keep it going."

The paper is distributed each week, starting Thursday and continuing through Saturday by carriers in various communities.

The staff would also like to make an appeal to the community to become involved and submit to any member of the staff any news or civic activities or anything of interest.

The paper is being offered at 20 cents a copy, 80 cents for monthly subscription or \$8.32 for a yearly subscription, payable in advance.






