The above-named City proposed to request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) to be used for the following project:

Approximately \$5,000 thru June 30, 1979

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not institute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and, accordingly, the above-named City has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows:

(1) The project is limited to improvement of recreational facilities and installation of a kitchen in the Happy Hill Recreation Center.

(2) Due to the limited scope of the proposed activities, the project will not affect any National Register properties or any properties that have been determined to be eligible for the register.

(3) The proposed project activities neither meet nor surpass the environmental thresholds set by HUD or the City of Winston-Salem.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named City which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at City Hall, 100 Main Street, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and is available for public examination and copying, upon request, at Room 19, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with the decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City to the office of the undersigned. Such written comments should be received at the address specified on or before July 10, 1978. All such comments so received will be considered and the City will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.
