Mr. Fred Hauser also paid tribute and offered congratulatory remarks on behalf of the Forsyth County Commissioners. A plaque from the Inter-Greek Council of Winston-Salem was presented by Soror Augusta Jeffers. Guests stood in awe as Mrs. Olivia Morgan, president of Phi Omega, the local chapter, presented an elegant silver punch bowl with tray, ladle, and matching cups as a token of the affection and support they hold for her.
