


Prized **Pianist to** Perform

The recital will be at 4 p.m. - not in the evening as previously announced - and is open to the public without charge.

Ms. Kaplan's program will include the Mozart Sonata in C Minor (K. 457); the second series from Debussy's "Images"; Samuel Barber's Sonata in E Flat Minor (Op. 26) and a Chopin group of two etudes, the E Flat Nocturne (Op. 5, No. 2) and the Fantasie in F. Minor (Op. 49).
