Weekly Study

The Being of God

Article 7

Q: Are there more Gods than one?
A: There is but one only, the living and true God.

This excerpt from the Westminster Shorter Catechism recognizes mankind's common consent that God exists as not a universal belief in only one God. Among errors corrupting the doctrine of God is polytheism (many gods). Nearly all ancient peoples outside Jewish monotheism (one God) held this depraved belief in the existence of many invisible, finite gods; therianthropism - representing gods as combinations of human and animal bodies; and henotheism - ascribing supreme power to one of the many gods. This idolatrous system, as in all apostasy from the true God and His pure worship, entailed great moral defilement (Rom. 1:21-32). Israel was warned about its "snare" and the curse" of Jehova upon its devotees (Deut. 11:28).

Today's church is menaced by a "broadminded" belief of the truth of religions and gods outside the Bible's revelation. As Elijah would not believe Baal to be another name for Jehovah (1 Kings 18:21) nor the three Hebrews serve ebchadnezzar's gods and worship his golden image so must we in the Cause of God and Truth combat error by advancing the doctrine of God's Unity. Unity means there is but one God whose divine nature is indivisible. Unity is proved: 1. philosophically - there is but one First Cause on which all beings depend; one Infinite Being filling all places at once; one Omnipotent Power; one All Perfect for the idea of two or more gods in our minds is self-contradictory; 2. historically - belief in one God is found in earliest records of all nations; and 3. biblically - God is declared as one; none beside Him; alone to be worshipped; and supreme over all so-called gods (Mal. 2:10, Isa. 44:6, Matt. 4:10, Deut. 10:17). These gods are imaginary, objects representing divinity, deified men, fallen spirits (Rev. 9:20).

John Gill said, "as he is a fool that says there is God, he is equally so who says there are more than one." Thomas Watson feared, "We have more idolators among us than we are aware of" (to trust riches, ability, self-righteousness and to love pleasures, children, and self more than God is idolry). One God means only one true religion. Stinner, Jesus said, "No arm comes to God but by Me. Trust Him now for pardon of your sins and acceptance before God.
