## FISHING

If the increase in price of petrol limits your fishing habits, just remember that there is some fishing to be had right at your back door: Salem Lake.

Fishing at Salem Lake can be just what you make it. Boats and motors can be rented, natural bait and lures are for sale and fishing can be done from the pier if you don't care for fishing from boats.

You may use your own boat but, motors are restricted to 10 horsepower. The fish population is great and can bear a lot of pressure. You can choose your specie or just fish for fish. The lake is stocked with bass, crappie, bream, catfish and now the white perch is on the scene again.

My method for fishing Salem Lake starts with bass during the early morning hours; sunrise. With or without luck, I switch to bream, using a flyrod and popping bugs after 10 a.m. Bream are always accommodating.

If the bream are hitting well and suddenly knock

off, I go back to bait casting because there are bass in the neighborhood.

Crappie are the next bet. They can be pursued during the early hours or most any time during the day. Hot weather may call for drifting if you are fishing from a boat.

Nocturnal fishing from the pier can produce crappie and catfish. Using a salt water outfit, surf rod

and open faced reel, treat your line with dressing and it will float. Hang your bait, live or stink, below a large plastic float and feed it line as it drifts out of sight, don't leave it unattended because when a big cat hits your line the whole thing can go over board. Now that you have a big one on, your only problem is to walk it to the shallow water and use a long handle dip net and lift it out.
