California Suite: Hilarious Scenes

One can bet the result will be quite interesting in the Little Theatre's production of Neil Simon's Cailfornia Suite July 20-22 and July 24-28.

The above-mentioned brouha is one of four separate scenes all set in the same California hotel room. The common theme is the various ways people have of getting on each other's

"The scenes are just totally ridiculous;" said Rolonda Watts, a Spelman college student who's cast in two of the scenes.

She joins Lewis Carter in the next to last scene, "Visitors from Chicago," in which two couples make each other miserable while supposedly sharing the good times of a vacation.

Watts also joins Nell Britton and Larry Womble in the first scene, "Visitors from New York," in which the wife catches her husband going astray.

According the Womble, who plays the husband caught red-handed and has a number of local theatre credits to his

name, the comedy comes in "how he tries to react to the situation and doesn't get out of it."
