Effective July 1, patient fees for the Family Planning Program at Reynolds Health Center will increase, based on a cost/time study by the Department of Human Resources.

All patients will be charged fees except those who (1) receive Medicaid, (2) teenagers and (3) those who are eligible for free family planning services under the Title XX program funded by the federal government.

All other patients will be charged a fee based on family size and income.

## NAUW National Conference Here

More than 400 delegates are expected in Winston-Salem for the national convention of the National Association of University Women Aug. 11-15 at the Winston-Salem Hyatt House.

Mrs. Nettie Manning of Winston-Salem will be running unopposed for reelection as national president of the NAUW during the four-day affair.

"We'll have workshops, seminars, luncheons, you name it," said Mrs. Manning, a retired teacher from the local public schools who has been a leader in educational and church circles.

The NAUW was founded in 1910 in Washington, D.C. among black women who had completed college. The aim of the association, said Mrs. Manning, is to promote education through fellowships, scholarships and gifts to institutions.

"I just got a report in from one chapter that gave five \$1,000 scholarships," she said. "Each of our chapters has to give at least one scholarship." More than half the money raised by the non-profit group goes directly to student financial aid.

Scheduled to speak are: Dr. Dudley E. Flood, assistant state superintendent of public instruction, Tuesday, Aug. 12; Dr. Barbara K. Phillips, national president of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Aug. 12; Mrs. Elizabeth Koontz, assistant state superintendent of public instruction, Thursday, Aug. 14; Mrs. Linnie Phelps Adams, a retired

educator from Columbia, S.C.

Other events are a 1 p.m. fashion show on Wednesday, Aug. 13, and a public meeting at 8 p.m. the same night.

The theme of the convention is "Quality Education: an Instrument of Power." "At this particular time in history, education is paramount," said Mrs. Manning. "It gives a black person a feeling of security to know that he does know."

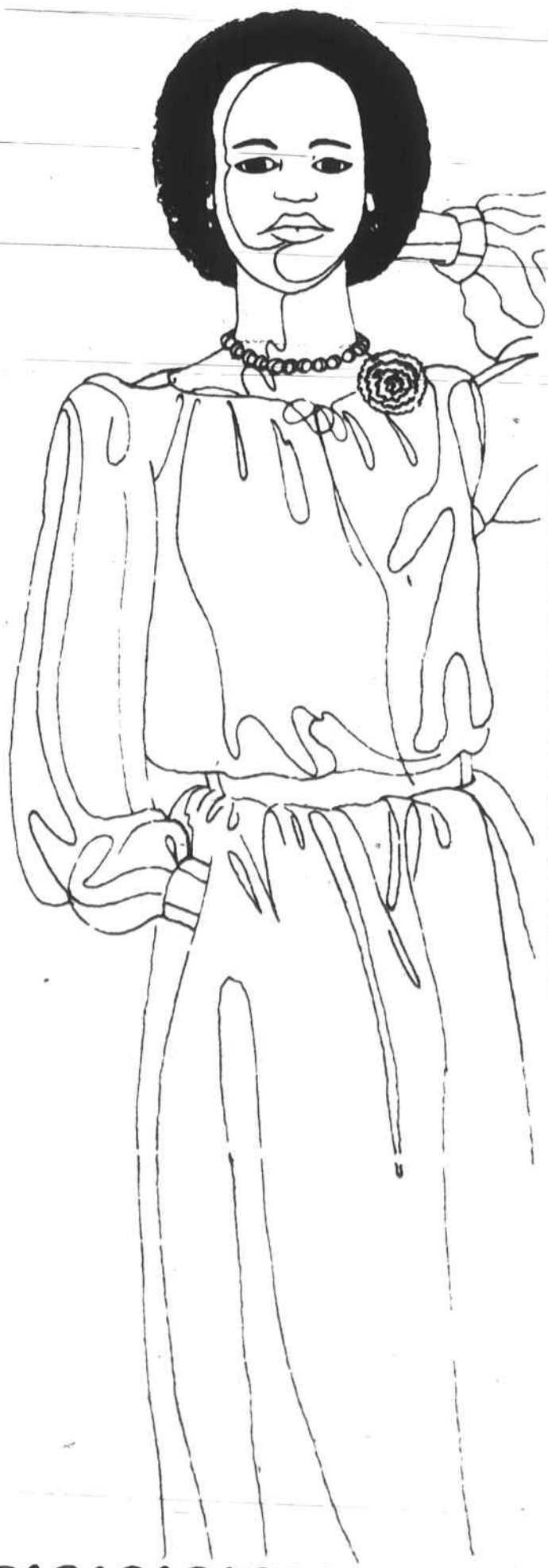
