Ram Homecoming '80

Winston-Salem State University will observe its 88th annual Founder's Day in conjunction with homecoming activities this week. This week's events have been combined in an effort to increase alumni participation, according to Marilyn Roseboro, director of public relations.

"Many alumni don't get to come to Founder's Day, because the event is usually held so close to homecoming," she said of this year's scheduling.

The Founder's Day program will begin at 10 a.m. Friday in Kenneth R. Williams Auditorium with governor Jim Hunt as the speaker. During the program, Hunt will receive an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree. The Founder's Day Processional will have an added attraction this year. Aside from the usual academic processional, alumni chapter presidents, and members of the senior class (class of 81), will also march.

Immediately following the program, the C.E. Gaines Athletic Center will be officially dedicated. The

Center was completed in 1976, and opened for use in 1978. The \$2.5 million structure houses Olympic-size swimming pool, exercise rooms, dance studio, administrative office, and a gymnasium with a seating capacity for 2,500 spectators.

The building was designed by Newman Calloway, Johnson, VanEtten, Winfree Architects/

Engineers of Winston-Salem, and was named in honor of Clarence E. "Bighouse" Gaines, WSSU basketball coach and athletic director.

An alumni reception will be held at 5:00 p.m. Friday at the Hyatt House. "Miss Alumni," Erlene Dennis of High Point will be crowned by last year's queen, Lucille Daniels of Washington, D.C. Chancellor H. Douglas Covington will

Speak along with National Alumni President, Clarence "Jeep" Jones.

Homecoming activities continue on Saturday with the traditional homecoming parade beginning at 10:00 a.m. The parade will form at the old Sears and Roebuck Co. building and begin down 4th street up to Claremont Avenue; and then back to the campus. The football game against Fayetteville State University at Bowman Gray Stadium starts at 1:30 p.m.

Saturday night, the Student Government Association will sponsor the homecoming show, featuring Cameo, Change, S.O.S. and Starpoint. The show will be held in the Winston-Salem Memorial Coliseum.

At 7:00 p.m. the WSSU Athletic Hall of Fame Banquet will be held in Benton Convention Center. The event is sponsored by the alumni and the athletic department. Inductees include Clarence "Bighouse" Gaines, Cleo Wallace, Charles Eaton, George Forte, Bobby Rowe in the area of athletics, also Leon Whitley, WSSU chancellor emeritus, Kenneth R.

Williams, and Charles B. Hauser for meritorious service. Following the banquet there will be an alumni dance at 10:00 p.m. also at the Convention Center.
