Bob Marley

Bob Marley's fans span the globe...from his native Jamaica to Japan; from Lagos, Nigeria to London, England; from Chicago to Copenhagen. Audiences and critics alike agree Bob Marley is a music force to be reckoned with. Perhaps Bob Marley and The Wailers' most notable concert was in June, 1979, at the Black Music Association convention in Philadelphia.

To say the audience was special would be an understatement. It was composed of music industry elite...performers, press, disc jockeys, personal managers, songwriters and record company executives who have attended hundreds of concerts.

Bob Marley held this audience spellbound, leaving them physically and emotionally spent and thoroughly entertained. After four encores even the most jaded observer agreed...Bob Marley is an electrifying performer. He truly deserves the designation



of superstar.

Offstage Bob Marley is a quiet man, yet his onstage charisma remains intact. One senses he is in close touch with his God; a Rastafarian since 1967, Marley speaks with conviction about his belief on Jah.

"The truth isn't home grown, it's a universal language. Jah gave man his life forever. In the end, all men will sing the same song. In my music I want people to recognize themselves."

Bob Marley's roots are in Jamaican poverty. He was born in February, 1945, in St. Ann's province in Northern Jamaica, the son of a Jamaican mother and a British army captain who left Jamaica before Bob was born. At age 16, he quit school to become a welder. At the same time he began his musical career, forming a group which would later become The Wailers. Soon thereafter he opened a small record shop

with his companion, Rita, who is now a member of the I-Threes, female background singers with Bob Marley and The Wailers.

In 1972, Bob Marley and The Wailers signed a recording contract with Island Records. Now, eight albums later, Bob Marley is the undisputed International King of Reggae Music.

In 1978, the African Delegation to the United Nations presented Bob Marley with the Third World Peace Medal. With his new album *Survival*, Bob Marley reciprocates. The cover of *Survival* depicts the flags of the independent African nations. The message of this album is unity of black people

No one would dispute how well Bob Marley communicates through his music, both onstage and on record. His message is clear...Celebrate Life, Take Action, Stand Up To Intimidation, and Walk With Dignity.

Survival says all this and more.

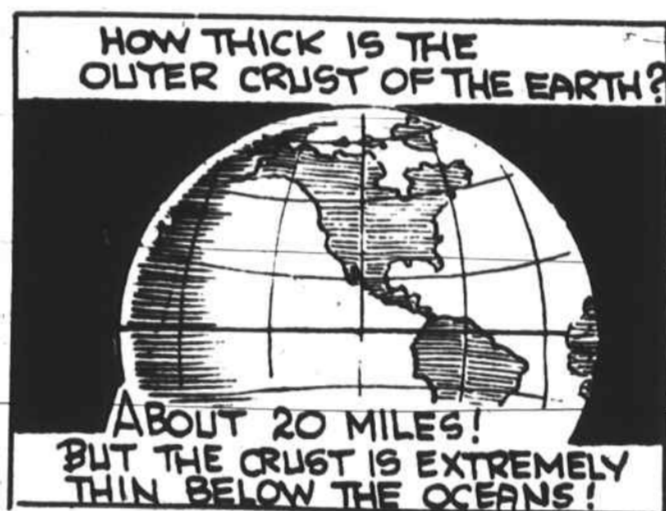
