Mrs. Jessup was a faithful Sunday School teacher and a member of several other church and civic organizations. As a mid-wife, she delivered many of her grandchildren and other children.

Surviving are her seven daughters, Mrs. Zillar McElroy of Bronx, New York, Mrs. Zelma Faison of the city, Mrs. Vera Cokley of Pilot Mountain, N.C., Mrs. Eliza Witcher of Beckley, W.
