The current caseload must be reviewed to convert to the new family unit requirement and the new

by September 30, 1982. A notice will be placed in all October food stamp mailings informing all recipients that recent changes in federal rules may cause their food stamp benefits to

be reduced or terminated. Kerr said, "These are the first set of changes in the Food Stamp Program.
