# Black College Movement Pays Off

Just two weeks before Black College Day '81, President Ronald Reagan, on September 15, 1981, signed an Executive Order that will funnel an additional \$9.6 million to the nation's Black colleges and allow these institutions to obtain equal opportunities in federally sponsored programs.

By special invitation from the president to a White House luncheon held "in conjunction with Black College Day" - which is sponsored by the Coalition for Black Colleges - over 100 distinguished guests including Black college presidents, alumni directors, student government leaders, church leaders and heads of some of the largest Black organizations in the country, applauded the President's comments on Black colleges in a rare showing of - Black - presidential support.

In attendance were: Bishop John H. Adams, Chairman of the 17-million-member Congress of National Black Churches; Tony Fisher, Vice President of the National Black Police Association; Thomas Dortch, President of the Council of National Alumni Associations, Inc. representing 85 of the 110 Black colleges; Dr. Lionel Newsom, President of Central State University; Dr. William Harvey, President of Hampton Institute; Dr. Howard Brabson, President of the National Association of Black Social Workers.

Others in attendance were: Dr. Leonard Spearman, President of Texas Southern University; Lorenzo Butler, former President of the United Negro College Fund Pre-Alumni Council; Archie Jefferson, Student Government President of Xavier

University; Dr. Prezell Roberts, President of National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education (the organization of all Black college presidents); Dr. H. Naylor Fitzhugh, Chairman of the Board of the National Association of Market Developers; Preston Edwards, Publisher of The Black Collegian magazine; and Calvin Rolark, Chairman of the Board, Black Media, Inc. and First Vice President of the National Newspaper Publisher's Association.

"We all know the federal government has a troublesome history of issuing federal orders with no teeth in them," the president reminded his audience. "Well, this one will be heard from again with an annual report card and they better pass."

Specifically, Black colleges will receive an increase of \$9.6 million in federal funds. Secretary of Education Terrel Bell will supervise the annual development of the order with each agency submitting a mid-year progress report to the secretary on its achievements. Also, each Black college president will be "given the opportunity to comment" on the proposed annual federal plan prior to presidential approval, the first of which is said to be ready by March 31, 1982.

The coalition, founded by Tony Brown, television host and syndicated columnist, started a movement with Black College Day '80 last year. The Black college, the Black church and hundreds of national Black organizations have since made this effort one now of presidential importance.

"It should never be forgotten that when educa-

tional opportunities were denied elsewhere, these institutions offered hope to Black Americans...and they did their job well," President Reagan continued. "It is through the educa-

tion they offered that individuals can make themselves into the type of people they choose to be instead of what some central planner says they should be."

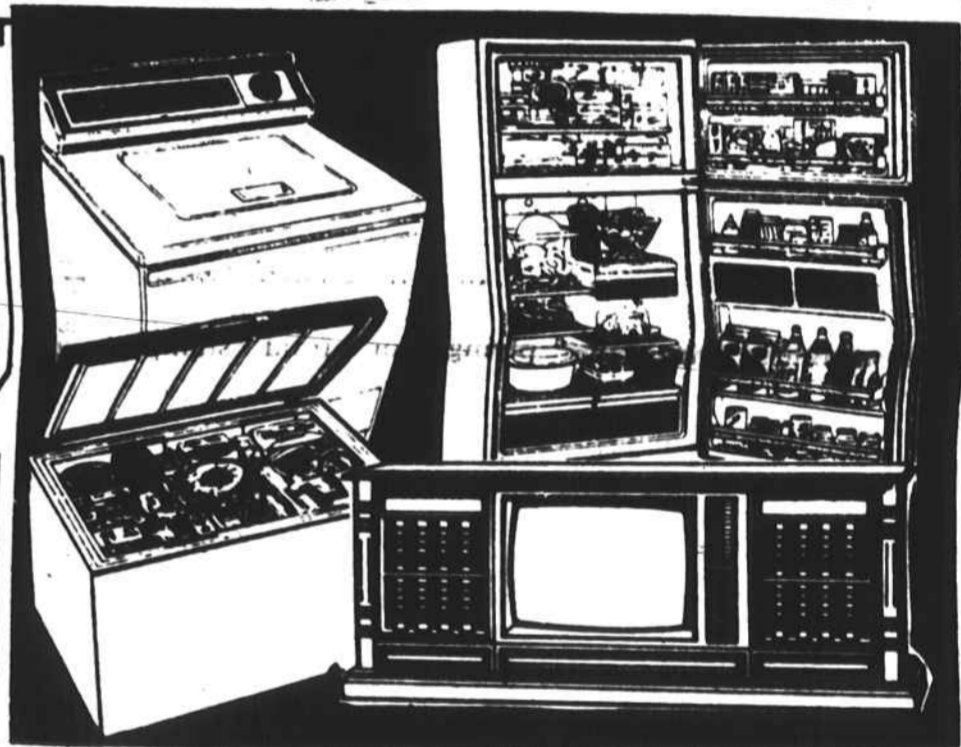
