Joan Armatrading



The lyrics of singer-songwriter Joan Armatrading's songs often strike both her fans and normally staid rock critics as deeply emotional slices of life. "She creates her own category," says England Melody Maker, "managing to be profoundly sensual without any of the arch coyness of the familiar stage sex symbol, powerful...emotionally open without displaying her scars too blatantly, and moving from joy to despair as naturally as night follows day."

Although it might sound like Joan bares her soul in every song,

the 30-year-old Armatrading, whose latest A&M Records LP is *Walk Under Ladders*, confesses that her inspirations for songs are often other people. "I just look around and see what's happening," she explains, a habit of observing that the West-Indian born Armatrading developed as a "loner" growing up in Birmingham, England, where she stood apart from her classmates at recesses in school and watched.

"The songs are usually from other people. They sound very personal, and, obviously, many of them are. You write a

whole load of songs and obviously you put yourself into it.

"But usually," she says of her song ideas, "the idea for a song starts when you see someone interesting, or when someone tells you about something that's happened to them and it makes you feel something strongly in yourself." It's obvious from Joan Armatrading's songs that when the sight of something around her makes her "feel something," she feels it on a level that makes her songs among the most emotionally powerful in today's music.

Sheinwold on Backgammon

HOW TO PLAY A ONE

You, White, roll 5-1 in the diagrammed position. How do you play it?

There's no problem about the five: you will surely come down from your midpoint to your 8-point. The only question is whether to play the one by moving from Black's 1-point to his 2-point or by moving from your 6-point to your 5-point.

If you split the back men you may have an easier time making an advanced point. You can make Black's 4-point, for example, with a 3-2 or a 2-3; but if you keep the two men together, you need a 3-3.

The trouble is that Black may roll a 6-4 and hit your blot on the 2-point. He may roll 4-4 and hit the blot on his 2-point and also make his 4-point. Or he may roll 5-5 and

hit the blot on his 1-point and make his 3-point. These are rather unlikely rolls, but you haven't gained enough to make up for the risk you have taken.

You might take the risk if you had nothing better to do with a one, but in this position you have a perfectly good move: from your 6-point to your 5-point.

Make the safe move and wait for a better chance to advance the men on Black's 1-point.

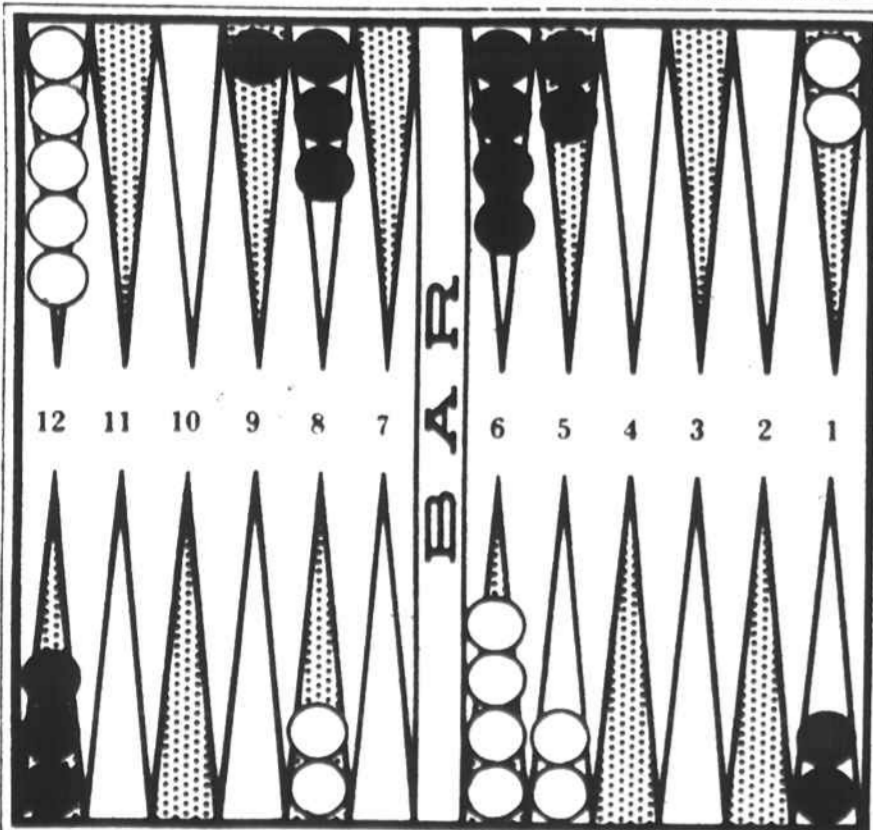
