in being innovative and creative, and I find that people respond to that sort of behavior."

"This has been a very delightful experience and it's exciting being around students who are so committed to a goal and faculty who have achieved their own goals," she says. "This is good for me because it's intellectually stimulating. I'm always working to learn a little bit more."

In a male-dominated society full of stigmas, many successful black women have experienced problems or, run into obstacles because they are considered double minorities. But Dr. Watts says she has not encountered such hindrances. Part of this, she says, is due to how she

was reared.

"It was instilled in me that you had a responsibility to do something and make a positive offering to your surroundings. That meant preparing yourself," Dr. Watts says. "That's the same thing my husband and I try to tell our children. They have a responsibility to be the best that they can in whatever they choose."

Although she is a woman who has always challenged herself to seek new knowledge, Velma Watts has fulfilled so many of her ambitions already. What can be left?

Plenty, she responds. "I'm going to always be involved in something that opens my eyes to something new."

than those belonging to Tim and Willis Jr. Miller visits schools to stress to youngsters the dangers of drugs. "I try to teach them that it's okay to have fun without drugs," Miller says, as he offers a widely unknown fact about marijuana. "Marijuana stays in your body 30 days," he says. "You never reach the same euphoria, so you smoke more."

Lessons on drug abuse need to be given more attention, Miller says. "I don't think the schools do enough to educate children about drugs," he says. "I would suggest as early as the fourth or fifth grade to educate kids about drugs."

As a drug abuse counselor, Miller sees many people who are dysfunctional because of drugs. "I teach them how to deal with their frustrations," he says. "I don't tell them what to do or how to do it."

What Miller does offer each person are alternatives to coping with their problems. He also recognizes the drug problem as bigger than those who misuse drugs. Miller says that our society promotes drug abuse, especially through television ads for coffee and drugs for obese people, to cite two.

But his biggest concerns are his clients, 90 percent of whom are narcotics users. The other 10 percent are mostly marijuana users.

Even when he leaves his office, Miller's workday is often not over. Many times, his friends seek his counsel.

"The job basically follows me everywhere I go," Miller says.

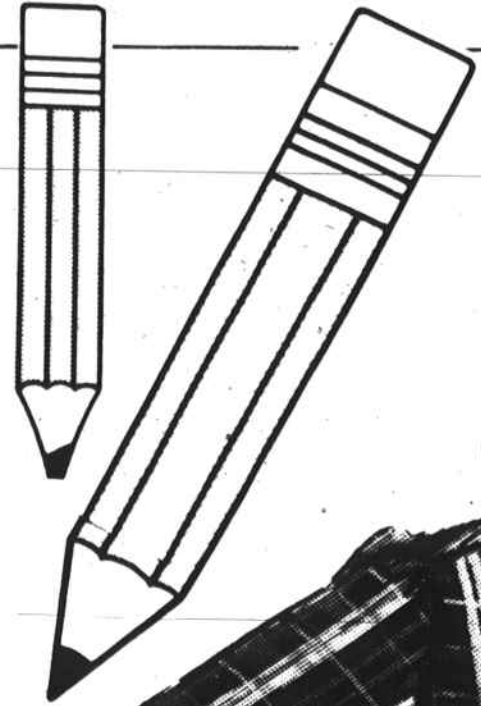
