Her corner desk in the student government office in Memorial Student Union is scattered with paraphernalia about life and God. Throughout the interview, her phone never stops ringing. Eager to please all who call her, she always answers, "I'm still smiling and how are you?"

Despite the demands of a college queen before her coronation, Mickens seems only a little edgy.

"I didn't run for this title for the sake of beauty," she says. "A lot of people knew me and respected me for what I was
