she says, because of an expanding crime rate in East Orange and to be closer to relatives in her native county. But she hasn't at all been idle. Besides being a member of Jackson's presidential campaign committee, she is also actively supporting Gov. Jim Hunt for the U.S. Senate, Eddie Knox for governor and the re-election effort of Congressman Steve Neal. "I'm working for all of the Democratic Party," Knox says. "You should see me sometimes. I look like a Christmas tree with all those buttons." Knox also finds time out of her busy day to visit the sick in hospitals. "I enjoy working," she says, "and whatever I do, I do the best I can. I can sit back and smile and say, 'I had something to do with getting the law on the books that says a landlord can't just put a tenant out on the street if he wants to.' Now they have to get a court order and I'm proud that I had something to do with that." "(Alderman) Larry Little will tell you right now that because of the work I did to help get people registered, I'm one of the reasons he's on the Board of Aldermen," she says.
