## Mack to speak at rally

Mack, a native of Winston-Salem and a graduate of Atkins High School, attended Winston-Salem Teachers College, now Winston-Salem State University, and did further study at Piedmont Bible College and the Seminary of Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte. He holds a bachelor's degree in theology and doctor of divinity degree from Miller University School of Religion in Plainfield, N.J. He also holds a certificate in pastoral counseling from Bowman Gray School of Medicine and Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem.

Mack was awarded the 1971 Minister of the Year plaque by the North Carolina NAACP for Christian leadership for racial justice. He is the founder of New Hope Baptist Church in Winston-Salem and has erected four new churches in the course of his ministry.

He is married to the former Miss Ollie Grier of Winston-Salem. They have four children.

## Disaster

If disaster strikes your home doing damage, one of the first persons to be called should be your insurance agent. You may also want to report the disaster to the insurance company in writing with a carbon copy to the agent.

"If you can get to it, take the insurance policy out. If it has been lost, your agent can get you a new copy," says Dr. Thelma Hinson, extension family resource management specialist, North Carolina State University.

When told that an insurance adjuster is visting the site, hold off on moving or removing items or repairing damage except to protect yourself or your belongings from further harm

You may also want to photograph the damage. The insurance company may ask you to itemize damaged items room by room and photos will help you to do so.

Some companies give a cash advance to help cover immediate expenses. This can be used for shelter, clothing and meals.
