### Blind bowlers banquet held

374; Danny Johnson, Allen Park, Mich., May 24-26, partially-sighted, 379, and Richard Johnson, sighted, 542.

High game award winners were: females; blind, Estella Lewis, 113; partially-sighted, Elizabeth Smith, 150, and sighted, Gladys Lee, 155.

Male winners in the category were: blind, Howard Patterson, 149; partially-sighted, Tyrone Willis, 159, and sighted, Jerry Mintz, 198.

The most improved award winners among the females were: blind, Sharon Joyce; partially-blind, Janice Emanuel, and sighted, Rosaland Thomas.

Male winners were: blind, Leo Burton; partially-sighted, Richard Barber, and sighted, Richard Johnson.

In the year-long team competition, the winners were: first-place team, Charles Roane, captain; Jessie Ballew, Tonya Davis and Danny Johnson; second place, Jerry Mintz, captain; Richard Barber, Janice Emanuel and Brian Lewis.

Four teams from the league will take part in the eighth annual American Blind Bowlers Association Auxiliary Tournament in

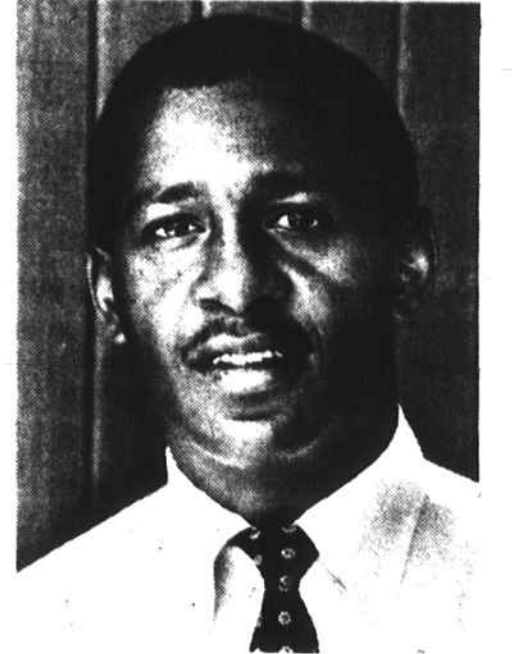
