

Freida Williams named development coordinator

The City of Winston-Salem has named Frieda Graham Williams as economic development coordinator. Her appointment completes the staff of the newly formed Development Department.

Williams, 29, will be leaving her current post with the state, where she is a specialist in the promotion of minority-owned businesses. Her duties include assisting in buyer/supplier conferences and publishing an annual minority purchase guide.

She has also worked as branch manager of Northwestern Bank Main Office in Durham, where she supervised a staff of six, made loans to retail and corporate borrowers and developed new business. She met her husband, Pete, at Northwestern.

"Her combination of skills in banking and in

work with minority and small businesses make her uniquely qualified for her new position," said Development Director, Allen Joines.

Williams earned her bachelor's degree in business administration from Western Carolina University and a master's degree in business administration from North Carolina Central University.

In Durham, Williams was an active member of the Heart Association, Chamber of Commerce, Volunteer Service Bureau and the Civitan Club.

In 1978, she was named Outstanding Northwestern Bank Branch Employee and in 1981 was named Outstanding Young Woman of America.

Williams will begin her duties June 1 and will report directly to Joines.
