"Dr. Drayton is my minister and I'm proud of it," Williams said. "We all are all proud of his contributions to our city and our state."

Helen Falls, chairman of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Convention, described Drayton as "a boardwalk of strength" as a long-time supporter of the convention.

"He's not a hypocrite," said Dr. Berthania Horne, past president of the Woman's Baptist State Convention in praise of his many years in the ministry. "You know where he stands. He doesn't back bite and he's a friend."

Like the rest, Roxanne Pitts, Forsyth County Senior Missionary representative, commended Drayton on his stands on issues.

"Dr. Drayton is a man of no partiality," she said, "common sense ... a man of love and understanding in Christianity and politic, hand in hand."
