### Mr. Willie Lee Henderson

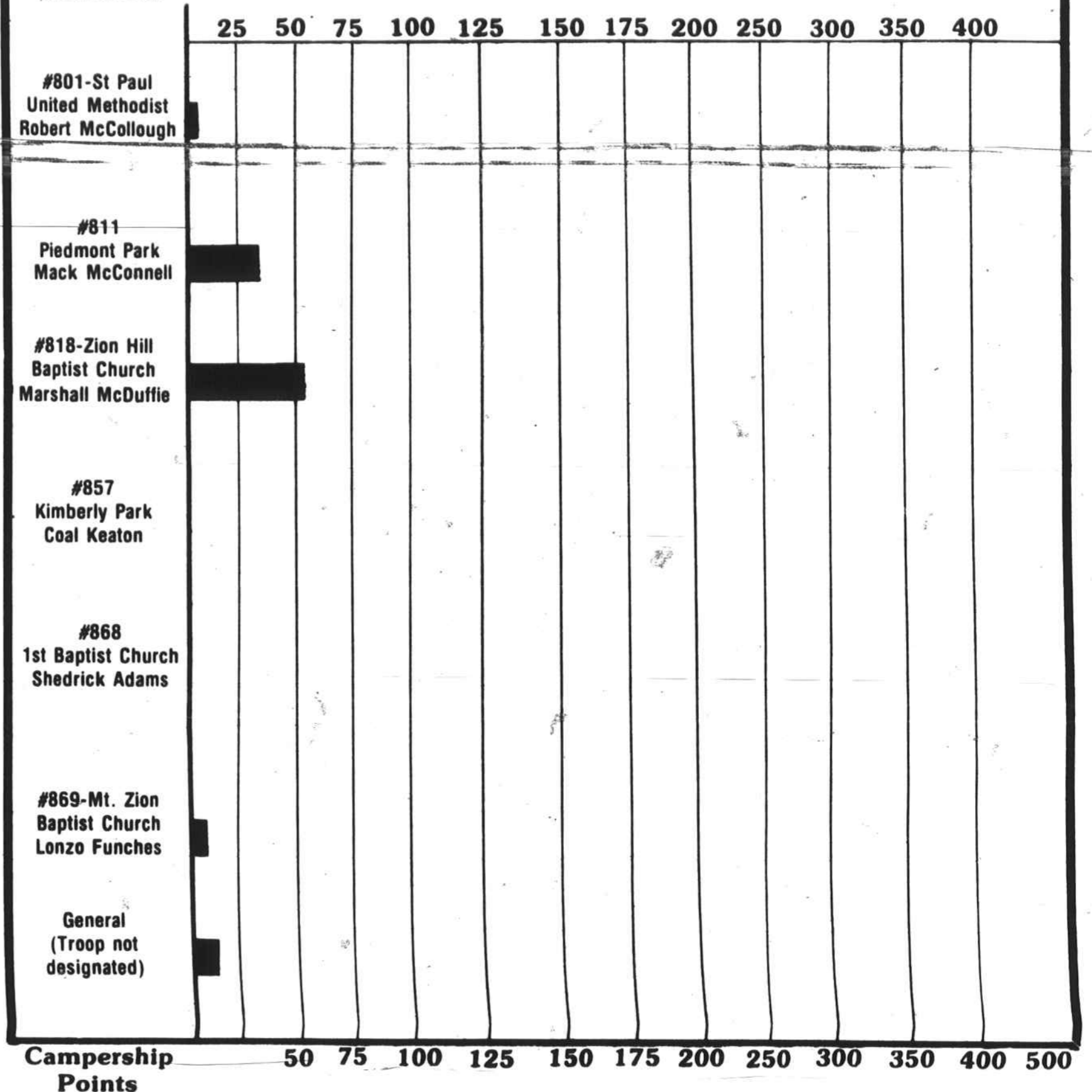
