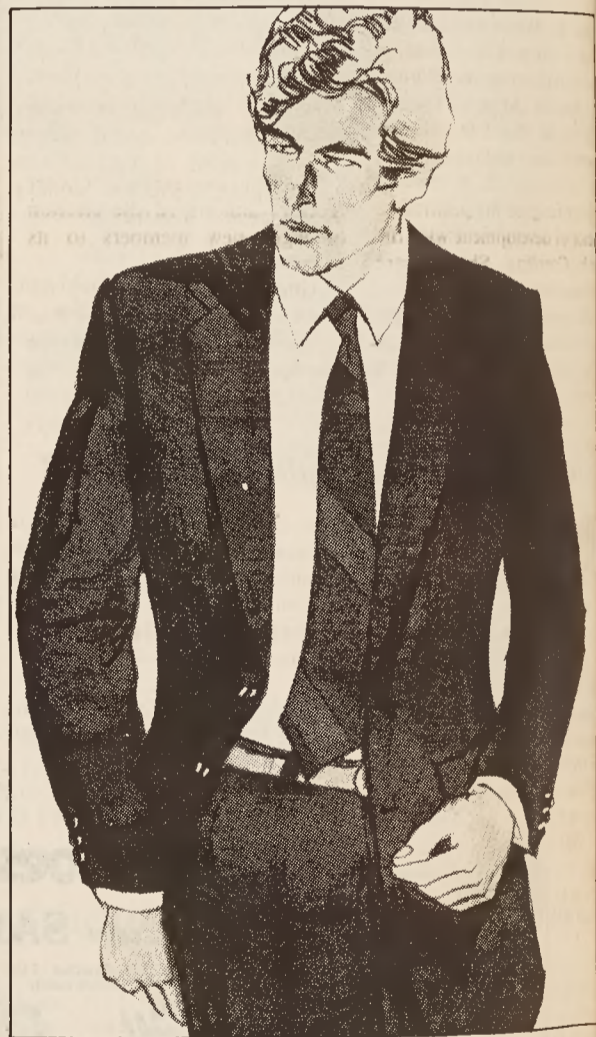
- Swiss Teams, Rosetta Hauser, Billie Matthews and Andrew Wilkes.
