maintaining a safe and healthy learning environment to advancing the child's physical and intellectual growth. She is also a member of the North Carolina Black Leadership Caucus and the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, for which she is national co-convenor for the youth rally. An English major with a minor in mass communications, Bridges hopes to attend law school to study communications law.
