Pender deployed to USS New Jersey

Navy Seaman **Derriek R. Pender** is currently participating in a five-month Western Pacific deployment aboard the battleship USS New Jersey, which has its home port in Long Beach, Calif. The New Jersey will lead six other ships on the first battle group to deploy to the Western Pacific since the Korean War. A 1984 graduate of East Forsyth High School, Pender joined the Navy in November 1984.

Navy Seaman **Donald J. Charlton** has completed recruit training at Recruit Training Command in Orlando, Fla.

During the eight-week training cycle, Charlton studied general military subjects designed to prepare him for further academic and on-the-job training in one of the Navy's 85 basic fields.

pays between \$24,337 and \$33,384 a year. Upshaw's annual salary was \$25,833, and he helped prepare budgets and heard employee grievances.

Upshaw was responsible for helping the director manage and plan within the department and running the department in the director's absence. He also gave counseling and supervision to the city's sanitation, buildings and grounds, and streets and garage divisions.

"It is unfortunate that this particular incident occurred," said Southeast Ward Alderman Larry W. Womble, who is chairman of the Public Works Committee. "He was doing a fantastic job. His work performance was of a high caliber."

City officials would not comment on Upshaw's conviction. Pat W. Swann, assistant city manager for public works, said no decision has been made on hiring a replacement for Upshaw.

Womble said Upshaw's conviction should not reflect on other city employees.

"I don't think it will have a negative effect on city politics or the hiring of blacks in city government," Womble said. "We should judge each person on his or her on qualifications and merits."

The city should hire a black person to replace Upshaw, Womble said. "It (Upshaw's conviction) should not have any bearing on us filling that position," he said.

A native of Topeka, Kan., Upshaw graduated in 1977 from Duke University, where he played football.

He worked for Duke's campus police for two and a half years before becoming the head of institutional services and security at Salem College.

While he worked in Winston-Salem, Upshaw was a community leader, Grace said in court. "He has more than 1,000 hours of community service," Grace said.

Upshaw is president of the Greater Winston-Salem Kiwanis Club and the treasurer of the Home Teacher Association at Our Lady of Mercy Catholic School, Grace said.

Upshaw also was a former president of the Academy of Law

Enforcement Administrators, Grace said. Upshaw could not be reached for comment.
