Ram wrestlers win two in Duals

Winston-Salem State wrestling Coach Melvin Fair was satisfied with his team's break-even start entering the holiday break.

But, belying his name, the Ram mentor hopes for a little bit better than fair come January.

"We're doing good right now," Fair said. "You can't complain with a .500 record with an all-freshman team. But my expectations are for a 75-percent winning record the second half of the season."

Fair hopes to add three wrestlers to his roster.

His team, which took a 2-2 record in dual meets into Wednesday night's match with Davidson at Gaines Center, won two of three matches in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association Duals in Salisbury last Saturday. The Ram grapplers finished third in the meet. WSSU beat Elizabeth City State 37-16 and Virginia State 33-18. The Rams lost to Norfolk State 33-18.

Harry Winford, a freshman from Mooresville, won all three of his matches in the 121-pound weight class. Winford improved his personal record to a team-best 15-4.

Henry Byrd, a freshman from Greensboro, also won all three of his matches. Byrd improved to 15-5 overall.

Danny Boden won two matches in the event at Livingstone. Boden, a freshman from Fayetteville, won the pair by pins and lost the third on a 3-0 decision. Boden upped his record to 14-7.

James McLinnaham, another freshman from Fayetteville, won two matches and had a draw to raise his record to 9-6.

Larry Dulin, a sophomore from Winston-Salem Reynolds, registered two wins and a draw as well.

Fair said that Livingstone came away as the most impressive team in the conference.

"Norfolk State beat us 33-18 and Livingstone beat Norfolk 42-3," Fair said. "Livingstone is the team to beat."

Mike Jones and John Spencer added 16 points each for Howard, 2-1 after a win over Campbell Monday night.


The Bison's win over the Colonials was a significant one for the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, which has little respect nationally after losing in six straight NCAA Tournament appearances. Two weeks ago, Howard lost to Villanova 71-61 in the first round of the NIT.

"Howard is the team to beat in the conference so far," North Carolina A&T Coach Don Corbett said. "Maybe by the time the conference schedule rolls around we will be ready for them. But right now we need to improve our inside-outside balance."

Conrad was coach of the Rams from 1950-1969. His teams posted a record of 74-83-8. His best squad was the 1962 Rams. who went 6-1-1. His 1955, 1959 and 1960 teams all went 6-2.

After his retirement as head coach in 1969, Conrad worked as an assistant until 1976.

However, his athletic achievement was not limited to coaching. Conrad was an all-America at Morgan State (then Morgan College).


