UNC-G Chancellor William E. Moran will hold his annual convocation for new students and their parents at 4 p.m. on Wed. Aug. 19 in Aycock Auditorium. A

new student picnic will follow at 5 p.m. in the residence hall quadrangle. A program of student skits and a party will take place at 8:30 p.m. in Cone Ballroom of Elliott University Center.

On Thursday and Friday, Aug. 20-21, students will be busy meeting their academic advisors and with placement examinations in a variety of subject areas. They also can take study skills workshops, library tours and learn about campus performance and media organizations. A 9 p.m. video party on Thursday and a 9 p.m. comedy show on Friday will top off both days.
