

Legislator to speak at First Baptist

Sidney A. Locks of Lumberton, a member of the North Carolina House of Representatives, will be the keynote speaker for the upcoming annual Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Emancipation Association program.

The association annually celebrates the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation by president Abraham Lincoln on Jan. 1, 1863. The program is held to raise funds for a scholarship project sponsored by the association and to focus attention on the need to support young people in institutions of higher learning.

Arlean D. Gill will preside at the program. Attorney Harold L. Kennedy Jr., president of the association, will present Locks. Attorney Reba Hayes will read the Emancipation Proclamation. The Rev. Wendell A. Johnson, host pastor, will give the welcome and benediction. The Rev. Harry A. Smith, treasurer, will present the annual statement and make the appeal for the scholarship fund. The Rev. S. L. Hodges, vice president, will give the opening prayer.

The program will take place on Friday, Dec. 31 at 11 a.m. at the First Baptist Church on Highland Avenue.

Locks, pastor of Sandy Grove Missionary Baptist Church, is a native of Opelousas, La. and a graduate of Wiley College and Morehouse School of Religion Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta.
