As first vice president of the General Baptist State Convention, Mendez oversees foreign missions. He is a current board member for the Black Theology Project and is a former board member of the YMCA and the Urban Arts Council.

Mendez has travelled extensively and has visited Central America, Nairobi, Kenya, Havana, West Africa and Hawaii.

He and his wife, Sarah, have two children.
