In addition to his Urban League responsibilities, ("Willie") Fair also devotes time to many other civic endeavors.

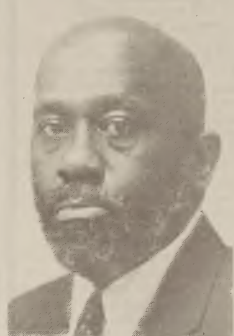
Last year he acted as chairman of the City of Miami Park and Advisory Board, and vice-chairman of the City of Miami's Health Facility Authority.

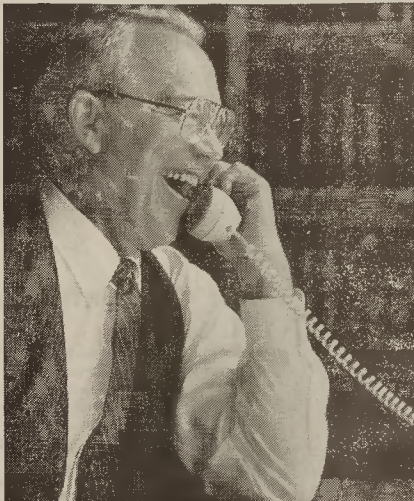
