

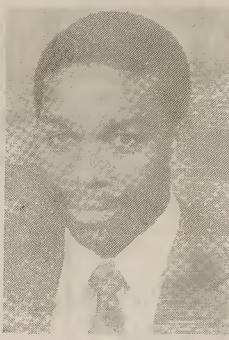
George B. Jackson to highlight local Men's Day

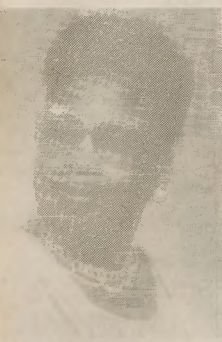
