Peggy Matthews to leave post at Forsyth County Council for Older Adults

Peggy F. Matthews, Executive Director of the Forsyth County Council for Older Adults since 1981, has submitted her resignation effective June 22.

The Executive Committee of the Board of directors of the Council at a meeting on May 31 accepted Mrs. Matthews' resignation with regret and with appreciation for her accomplishments as Executive Director.

The Council for Older Adults consists of 76 member agencies committed to enhancing the quality of life for the elderly of Forsyth County.

The Council serves as a resource to agencies and professionals by establishing a forum for

the exchange of information and mutual support.

Additionally the Council, under Mrs. Matthews' direction, has sponsored educational events for professionals and the community. Conferences have included "Mapping a Stroke" with Patricia Neal as keynote speaker; "Caring for Aging Relatives"; The Shepherd Center Conference; and the 1988 conference, "Aging and Shelter in Western North Carolina."

Mrs. Matthews, as executive director, has been instrumental in the development of a range of programs devoted to the needs of the elderly.

The Council coordinates the Lawyer Referral Service for older

adults, the Senior Health Insurance Information Program, and a monthly meeting of Council agencies. Additionally, the Council produces a newsletter, "The Senior Scene," which provides information both to agencies serving the elderly and to older people living in the community.

According to David Piner, president of the Board of Directors of the Forsyth County Council for Older Adults, many of the agency's accomplishments are directly attributable to the hard work of Peggy Matthews. He said that "Mrs. Matthews has been an effective advocate for the needs of older people in Forsyth County and has served the community

devotedly. The Council will miss her expertise and leadership."

A reception honoring Mrs. Matthews will be held on Tuesday, June 21 from 2 to 3:30 p.m. at the public library as part of the annual meeting of the Forsyth County Council for Older Adults. The public is invited.


In introducing the representa-
