with the victims of the war in Ango-la, many of them women and chil-dren who had been mutilated by land mines. He said they all expressed their desires for peace and normalized relations with the United States.

The delegation returned with a The delegation returned with a 20-page report listing human rights violations,including allegations of land mines being placed by UNITA rebels in areas where children play. "UNITA can only survive through U. S. assistance to South Africa" "said Mender." South Africa

Africa," said Mendez. "South Africa is a terrorist state. Why then does the Reagan Administration support

terrorism against Angola?" He said that South Africa "could not contin-ue to fight wars and contribute to the destabilization" of surrounding nations without U.S. support.

Mendez said the delegation supported the four nation peace talks currently taking place con-cerning Angola and Namibia. "Angola is a new independent, sovereign state that has the right to determine it's destiny," he said. "I soveregg state that has the right to determine it's destiny," he said. "I would advise the United States to look at these countries that are developing and learn to live with them."
