Serving as maid of honor was Mary H. Speas of Winston-Salem.

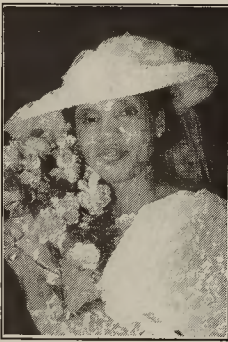
