

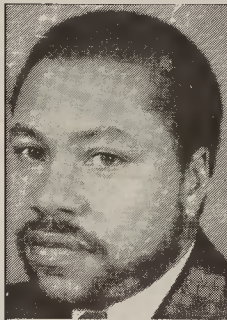
Alex Johnson to speak at Zion Memorial

The speaker for the occasion will be Dr. Alex Johnson, acting vice chancellor for academic affairs at Winston-Salem State University.

A native of Concord, Johnson served on the WSSU staff and faculty since 1981. In addition to his current position, he was assistant vice chancellor for academic affairs and executive assistant to the chancellor. He earned degrees from WSSU, Johnson College and Pennsylvania State University.
